Prefab Vinyl Railing

eed a porch railing that lasts? The Finyl Rail structural vinyl railing is extruded from rigid PVC and has a hefty wall thickness of 5/16 inch. The railing system comes in a variety of round and rectangular profiles, and can be custom fabricated to match requirements for



rise/run, stair radius, inside and outside corners, and other design considerations. All components are prefabricated and shipped preassembled; oversize systems are provided in smaller sections that are then fit together on site. The seamless railings are coated with a durable high-gloss finish to resist corrosion, even when exposed to salt air, and are mounted over steel brackets. All fasteners are concealed. Available in white (round stock also comes

in gray), Finyl Rail costs between \$35 and \$53 per linear foot, depending on the style.

Temporary Door Latch

Then the doors are hung before the locksets are delivered, many builders resort to makeshift turnbuckles or bent-over nails to keep the doors closed. But these measures don't hold up well



on site, and the result is often damaged doors and door jambs. One easy fix is the Sav-A-Door, a two-piece spring-loaded plastic insert that fits most standard lockset bores. No tools are required for installation just compress the S-shaped handle section, fit it into the lockset bore, and release. A plastic latch piece slides through the edge bore and is adjustable for both 23/8- and 23/4-

esigned to monitor spaces smaller than 800 sq. ft., the infrared sensor in the Decorator Wall Switch occupancy sensor detects hand and walking move-

ments up to 20 and 40 feet away, respectively. The device includes a daylight override that keeps the lights off in bright sunlight, despite detecting occupants in the room; an adjustable time-delay feature can also be set to keep the light on for up to 20 min-





utes after occupants leave the area. Available with threeway switching and in low-voltage models, the switch recesses fully into a standard electrical box and comes with a matching GFCI wall plate in white or ivory. The switch can also be ganged together with standard switches and outlets.

new floor-warming product provides a simple solution to radiant-floor retrofits for small areas. The electric *Delta-Warm* floor-warming cable is made from Kapton-insulated resistance wire encased in silicone rubber and wrapped by an aluminum grounding braid; an outer silicone rubber jacket provides additional

electrical insulation. The cable is less than ¹/₄ inch in diameter and can be placed directly on wood or cement-board substrate; it is then covered with thinset mortar or light-



weight concrete. According to the manufacturer, Delta-Warm is suitable for use with any floor covering, including ceramic and vinyl tile, marble, concrete, carpet, and wood. Supplied in standard factory-terminated lengths, the installation cost runs between \$4 and \$16 per sq. ft., depending on the size of the area to be heated.
