The material is said to be easier to install and repair than other floating laminate flooring because it is glued only at the upper edge of the tongue. Available in more than 60 styles, including 32 wood-

plank patterns, the flooring can be installed over a foam backer on any sound, level subfloor. Material cost ranges from \$4.50 to \$5.50 per square foot.

corrugated stainless steel gas tubing called Diamondback requires 75% fewer fittings than black iron pipe, so it installs up to three times faster and with fewer leaks, according to the manufacturer. Flexible enough for 3-inch-radius bends, the tubing uses multiport manifolds for easy remodeling, retrofit, or expansion. No special

tools are needed for installation, and although the flexible tubing is more

expensive than black iron pipe

(\$2.42 per foot for 1/2-inchdiameter up to \$4.95 per foot for 1-inch-diameter), the extra cost should be more than offset by the decrease in labor.



Reflective Insulation

Three foil-faced products can be used to reflect radiant energy into or away from living space. *Astro-Foil Reflective Insulation* (35¢ per sq. ft.) sandwiches polyethylene air pockets between two layers of foil. Rolls come in various widths, with or without



edge stapling tabs, and provide R-15 when used as ground cover, R-7.3 on walls, and R-5.4 in attics.

Perforated R+ Heatshield (15¢ per sq. ft.) can be laid over existing attic floor insulation, where it reflects heat while allowing moisture to escape. A solid version serves as a vapor barrier when attached to rafters, kneewalls, and attic gables, or between floor joists and subfloors.
