drywall surface isn't all it's cracked up to be after a few years in service. It's easily dented, and the seams and fasteners have a



tendency to show through, even on carefully finished work. Brush, roll, or spray Plaster-Weld bonding agent onto painted or papered drywall to prep for a smooth, hard plaster, skim-coat finish over the old surface. A gallon of the water-soluble polyvinyl acetate preps up to 400 square feet, and costs about \$20.

Get Centered

ath is wonderful stuff, but it slows some of us way down. Finding the mathematical center is a common requirement of carpentry layout, made simple with the 25-foot CenterPoint tape measure. Inches and feet are marked along one edge, and the same markings are represented on the opposite edge at half-scale. All it takes to find the center is to read the same dimension on the other edge. Save your construction calculator for finding the volume of a

Peerless Plastic Plug

inear slits add a new twist to the plastic wall anchor, enabling the *HUD Go Anywhere Anchor* to expand in a predrilled hole for added gripping power in wallboard, aerated concrete, and hollow wall panels. The insert bunches up on







the back side of a hollow wall installation, acting like a toggle anchor. A blister combo-pack includes 100 screws, 100 anchors, and a drill bit, for \$14.50; the 500-count combo-pack sells for \$49.50.

substrate for roofing and siding. The ⁵/s-inch panel is also available in tongue-and-groove profile, eliminating the need for H-clips when applied to 24-inch rafter spacing. Panels are stocked by distributors at a cost competitive with plywood.

Plastic Framing Stock

To complement low-to-no-maintenance plastic-composite decking material, *Carefree Structural Lumber* is available in 2x8, 2x10, 4x4, and 4x6 dimensions. On 12-inch framing centers, a 2x8 will span 74 inches with an 80-psf combined



load. Made of the same material as Carefree decking (recycled high-density polyethylene and wood fibers), but reinforced with oriented fiberglass strands, the lumber is impervious to water and won't rot, split, or shrink. Longevity comes at a premium price: the 2x8 and 4x4 cost \$5.25 per linear foot, the 2x10 costs \$6.60, and the 4x6 costs \$9.10 per linear foot.

Impalement Protection

The last thing you want on your jobsite is an injury. To prevent impalement on exposed rebar, the *Carnie Cap* rebar guard system covers an 8-foot run of #3 to #8 vertical bar ends using only two caps to cradle a 2x4 guardrail. Unlike individ-



ual caps, the railing adds trip, stumble, and fall protection, and takes advantage of lumber already on site. The caps are sold in boxes of 100 for \$250. A larger size fits #5 to #18 vertical bar ends, is available for up to 2-inch-diameter rebar, and uses 2x6 railing stock. CALOSHA approved.

ow do you mount a round junction box at the peak of a cathedral ceiling? One answer is to use an FB90 Fan & Fixture

Mounting Box. The UL-listed plastic box fits any ceiling angle up to 90 degrees, supports 35 pounds, and has a textured, paintable surface. The box attaches to a short length of 2x4, which is then

screwed to the rafters. The model *FB45* provides a similar solution for sloped ceilings. Expect to pay \$9.90 for the 90, and \$11.50 for the 45.
