minum, with or without gas. My first, brief experience with the unit, using both fluxcored wire and gasshielded solid wire, was easy, uncomplicated, and fun. The Handler 175 weighs 65 pounds, comes with a 10-foot gun, 10-foot cable and clamp, gas hose and regulator, solenoid valve, wire

spool adapter, and more — no additional kits needed. Start sticking your own steel together on a routine basis for \$643.

A s long as you know that vinyl siding must be fastened through the sheathing into solid framing, you'll appreciate the new *STUDfinder* feature of Monogram RigidForm 180 Siding. For 16-inch on-center applications,



there are 10 nail slots in the hem, each with a designated letter that repeats every 16 inches. After locating the first stud, you should find the next one at the next matching letter, or every 10th slot. Very handy for siding over building paper, and if you don't know your alphabet, just match the funny shapes.
