Two-Step

've always wondered why the other side of a step ladder wasn't put to better use; the *FM-1000 Series Twin Front Stepladder* answers that question neatly with a professional line of ladders from 4 to 16 feet long. Both sides of the fiberglass ladders are Type 1A, duty-rated up to 300-lb. for simultaneous use. The attachment points of the inside-mounted spreader braces are secured with oversized rivets and reinforced with backer plates to prevent breakout. Prices range from \$216 to \$919.

othing organizes a job site or treats your stock better than a sawhorse. On the negative side, they're awkward to transport. Instead of building disposable sets, consider a pair of *Sawhorse Connection* brackets. Common 2x4 stock slides neatly into the welded aluminum tubing, which can be secured with nails or screws or left loose for quick disassembly. Slotting the ends of a 2x6 gives you a high-rise cross-member that'll keep your sawblade out of harm's way. A single bracket is rated for 750 pounds; one kit makes two horses and costs \$65.

Go Long

Although it won't fit comfortably in my back pocket like my old 100-footer, the *Fat Max 100-foot tape measure* has a bright yellow, stainless-steel blade and large, easy-to-read digits with calibrations in ¹/8-inch increments. With a 3:1 gear ratio, the hand-cranked retriever will give any spring-loaded tape a run for the



money. A wrap-around rubber grip makes the tape easy to handle. The 100-footer costs \$30; a 50-foot version costs \$20.

Better Bolting

common toggle bolts have a common drawback: Once installed, you're committed — withdraw the bolt and the toggle's lost inside the cavity. The *Strap-Toggle* secures snugly against the interior surface, held in place by the ratchet-style plastic legs and locking installation cap. You can reinstall the bolt as often as needed. The strap is available in four hole diameters: 3/16, 1/4, 3/8, and 1/2 inch. Prices vary.

Chill Out

ow temperatures normally spell the end of the outdoor painting season, which is just too bad for some sched-



ules. *LowTemp35* caulk, primer, and paint stretch the season by allowing finishing work to continue down to 35°F, according to the manufacturer. The topcoat is available in flat and satin finishes in 400 colors. The caulk costs \$3, the primer costs \$29, and the paint retails for \$24 per gallon from local distributors.




"sure-fire" economical solution. Because its primary application is between floors, the housing is non-IC-rated. The incandescent fixture costs \$81.

Being at the controls of a skid-steer loader is already fun, so it's not entirely fair to make you more comfortable than the rest of the crew, too. However, *Bobcat* now offers optional factory-installed air-conditioning (and heat) in a "deluxe" cab



enclosure for models 773 turbo, 863, 873, 963, and the 864 track loader. The AC unit draws no more than 3.5 hp from the engine and can lower the cab temperature by 30°F. The cushy package adds \$2,995 to the base price of the loader.

The performance of hammer-actuated stick guns can be less than thrilling. For the occasional PAF, the *Twist-R* .22



caliber powder-actuated tool may be what you're looking for. To drive a fastener at any of the four power levels (which are color coded), press the barrel against the surface being fastened and give the top knob a quarter-turn clockwise. Fasten it the first time with no missed swings or half-hits. The Twist-R costs \$45.
