Laminated Glass

or greater protection against flying objects in severe storms or for reducing noise, laminated (or impact-resistant) glass is an option worth investigating for your clients. Two layers of annealed, tempered, or heat-

strengthened glass are fused under heat and pressure to a polyvinyl butyl core, resulting in a product that is similar to the safety glass found in automotive windshields. It's two to four times stronger than a traditional window, and if the glass should break, the number of shards is reduced, according to the manufacturer. Windows with Saflex, KeepSafe, and KeepSafe Maximum come with 0.030-, 0.060-, and 0.090-inch interlayers and cost approximately 130% to 250% more than a comparable 24x50-inch, double-glazed, low-E, argon-filled window.


