

utomatic zone dampers can transform a roast-thenfreeze forced-air heating system into something a lot more comfortable — but what if the house you want to retrofit has ductwork buried under a slab, or in a crawlspace you last fit into when you were 22? Say hello to the



AZR (Automatic Zone Register). Instead of mounting midstream in the ductwork like most zone dampers, the AZR slips into an existing register opening, with no modifications to existing ducts. Run a plenum-rated 'stat wire back through the duct to a zone panel or stand-alone thermostat, and you're done. Sizes are currently limited to 10x4, 12x4, 10x6, and 12x6, with prices starting at around \$50.

suspended ceiling is often the best way to hide overhead mechanical clutter — but the exposed metal grid leaves something to be desired.
